Pastor's Note

FULL TO THE BRIM!

Blaise Pascal, the brilliant 17th French mathematician, penned a lifetime of thoughts on little scraps of paper that he stuffed into the lining of his coat. These pensees were found and published after his death. His book by that name is still in print. Pensee 148 reads like this: "The infinite abyss can be filled with only an infinite and immutable reality – in other words by God himself." That is to say, the empty place in us cannot finally be filled by stuff. It cannot be filled by success. It cannot be filled by culture. It cannot even be filled by religion – it can only be filled by the infinite, by God himself.

Religion and God of course are not the same thing. You can have religion without much God and some people encounter God without much religion. There is an analogy for their relationship that, if you don't push it too far, I think is helpful. According to this metaphor, religion is like a beautiful wine chalice, and God is like the fine wine inside the chalice. The chalice cannot hold all the wine in the world of course. In the same way, religion can never "contain" all of God. But the chalice enables you to drink the wine. In the same way religion provides a way for us to encounter God.

To continue the analogy, you can decorate this chalice; you can make it out of finest gold and deck with out with lovely jewels. But without wine inside, the chalice is just a pretty bauble. In the same way, you can make religion beautiful with fine liturgy, lovely buildings, great music and beautiful theology, but without the living God, religion is just a nice old cultural artifact. You can make sure the chalice does not leak, patching up holes and pounding out dents. Similarly, we can strive to make sure that our religion is in good repair, that the institution faithfully holds to what truth we can know about God and does not let it leak away. But still it's quite possible for even the most glorious chalice imaginable to be quite empty of the wine. In the same way, it's quite and terribly possible for religion to be empty of God.

My wish for all of us this Christmas and in the new year is that our chalices be full --- full to the brim ----with the wine of God --- the real, living God ---- come to us as "Immanuel."
