### Pastor's Note

Let me say right up front: I am thoroughly enjoying my time here at Tazewell Presbyterian Church and Blacks' Chapel. There is a good spirit here --- the Spirit of the Lord, --- and I feel blessed to be your pastor.

One of the disturbing but fascinating stories in the Scriptures — at least for me — comes from Mark 4:35-41. It's a dramatic, life-and-death story: a story that involves Jesus, the disciples, a boat, and what was meant to be a smooth and safe journey across the Sea of Galilee. You are probably familiar with this story but it was only later in my life, in a closer examination of this tale, that I realized this harrowing near-death experience began with Jesus saying, "Let's get to the other side of the lake." In other words, Jesus initiates this trip, this life-and-death episode.

That is why the story is so disturbing ... because essentially it contradicts so much of what we want to believe about faith and being a follower of Christ: --- i.e. just believe in Jesus and everything will be okay. But the story suggests that sometimes He leads us into situations that feel anything but okay!

Remember that in the story many of the disciples were seasoned fishermen. They had probably fished the Sea of Galilee hundreds if not thousands of times. They were experts and the truth is they would have never set sail if they knew danger was imminent.

Such are our lives. Such are our hearts and minds. Such are our goals. We pride ourselves in becoming experts and being captains of our own lives, circumstances, and world until we realize that no matter how much we've charted the seas, we never have full control of our lives or the seas.

The hope of the gospel is not that God promises that everything will be okay (health, wealth, a life of bliss), but that God is with us --- through all circumstances. Good is present in our mountaintops and valleys, in the calm seas and in the ferocity of the storm...and everything in between ....present even --- and especially--- in our doubts, pain, and mess.

The story is intriguing, isn't it? The disciples feared for their lives. They even wondered and openly questioned how Jesus could be sleeping during such an occasion. But Jesus never promised a quick, easy, and straight journey. Jesus never promised a smooth sail on a deckedout yacht. He does promise one thing: "Let's get to the other side of the lake." And if He promises to get us to the other side of the lake, He will. Mess, doubts, pain, tension, and all.
